

NATIONAL COALITION OF 100 BLACK WOMEN, INC. OUR CHAPTER AND NATIONAL HISTORY



Founded in New York City in 1970, The National Coalition of 100 Black Women (NCBW), Inc. was founded to advocate on behalf of Black women and girls, promote leadership development and encourage gender equity in the areas of health, education, economic empowerment and civic engagement.

Structured for action, NCBW is committed to being a uniting voice for more than 20 million Black women throughout the nation. As a leadership forum, NCBW serves as a collective to help elevate the quality of life for women of all walks of life and professional industries, with a focus on providing advocacy for fair housing, education, healthcare, pay equity, and access to gainful employment.

NCBW currently has over 2,800 members across 62 chapters representing 27 states and the District of Columbia. Our diverse membership is comprised of professional women who are actively involved in the social, political, and economic pulse of their communities.

The Phoenix Metropolitan Chapter, an Arizona based 501(c)(3), was chartered on November 14, 2015, with forty-six dynamic Black women leaders including entrepreneurs, lawyers, doctors, educators, corporate executives, broadcast journalists, and philanthropists.

Together, we have embarked upon this journey to advocate on behalf of Black women and girls in the areas of health, education, economic empowerment and civic engagement. Since our chartering in 2015, we have made significant strides towards accomplishing our mission through collaboration and building strategic alliances. We will continue to align ourselves with like-minded organizations who strive to move with purpose, passion, and power. NCBW recognizes a responsibility to mobilize and organize the Black community toward greater understanding and engagement in political and legislative processes at every level of government. We further commit ourselves to impacting the community by advocating for policies and practices that will serve as the catalysts for effecting sustainable change.

As advocates, we engage in intentional activities that identify, develop, groom, and empower Black women leaders. We ensure the enactment of legislation that favorably impacts not only Black women, but all women, while working with fervor to halt legislation that negatively impacts women. We are here to support and champion future generations of successful Black women, beginning with our girls.



Sister-Nomic\$ is an NCBW Economic Empowerment Program that is a philosophical commitment to consider ourselves FIRST in economic decisions. When we suffer, the community suffers!

The Sister-Nomic\$ economic sustainability framework is based on self-preservation in all financial decisions and teaches the following principles:

Reduce debt and increase assets with each financial decision.

- Invest in both short term and long-term investments that will build net worth.
- Embrace financial security and create generational wealth.
- Seek and share information with family and friends to facilitate informed financial decisions.
- Contribute to the economic strength of the Black community by supporting Black institutions and businesses.
- Remain informed and engaged on political decisions that impact the wellbeing of the Black community.
- Patronize majority owned businesses that respect, support, and employ members of the Black community and collaborate with our organizations.

Through Economic Empowerment programming and local and national partnerships, Sister-Nomic\$ is designed to improve the economic wellbeing of Black women and their families by sharing strategies and resources to increase financial literacy, increase homeownership, close the pay gap, cultivate successful entrepreneurs, and increase youth financial literacy.

True pay equity requires a multifaceted strategy that addresses both the gendered and racialized injustices that Black women encounter every day. Our goal is always to be intentional, impactful, and solution oriented. We invite you on this journey with us to wield our collective influence and resources on the road to ensuring greater equity and inclusion wherever inequities persist. We are stronger together!

Planning and zoning have been essential to cities and their economic development, and with the rapid growth of Arizona, it has now become a vocal point for thriving and growing cities. Understanding your city's planning and zoning can empower black women-owned businesses as prospective entrepreneurs can come to their city to ask about sites they have their eye on to open a business, make sure the zoning is allowed for the business they have in mind, and be fully educated on the zoning requirements as zoning also regulates things such as business signage, occupancy, improvements, and business activities. Failing to secure applicable zoning permits or variances can lead to fines, closure of a business, and even criminal prosecution, which is why planning and zoning education is essential for starting entrepreneurs. In my personal opinion, the biggest hurdle is access. In most communities, there is an underserved population who doesn't have access to what's going on in their local community or government. They are usually not aware, have few opportunities to engage, and their voices are not heard regarding future plans for their communities. As a Planning and Zoning commissioner and African-American woman, I understand the advocacy that is necessary for black women-owned businesses first to have a fair chance in local cities and, secondly, to have the opportunity to thrive. Commissioners are encouraged to bring their diverse perspectives and backgrounds to the commission as we serve in an advisory role and should reflect our community, their wishes and accommodate their economic needs. Some of the most significant issues in planning and zoning circles are usually affordability and equity, and that's why my sole purpose as a local commissioner is to be an advocate.

Peoria, Arizona is a vibrant city with many business opportunities that go along with the city's general plan. Our city promotes economic prosperity, which is an exciting opportunity for black-owned businesses as it also entails economic empowerment for our community through planning to open your business in Peoria! Peoria is such a diverse and growing city, so it needs a diverse range of businesses to accommodate every resident. I encourage all those planning to start a business in Peoria to look at the information that is out there by utilizing our city's website along with connecting with programs that assist beginning entrepreneurs, such as Peoria Forward and of course NCBW as their local Economic Empowerment committee is providing endless education and advocacy. Peoria may just be the perfect place to start a new business!

Madam C. J. Walker

BORN SARAH BREEDLOVE (1867 - 1919)

Born on December 23, 1867 on a Delta, Louisiana plantation, this daughter of former slaves transformed herself from an uneducated farm laborer and laundress into one of the twentieth century's most successful, self-made women entrepreneurs. Orphaned at age seven, she often said, "I got my start by giving myself a start."

THE 1890's

Sarah began to suffer from a scalp ailment that caused her to lose most of her hair. After experimenting with many homemade remedies and store-bought products, she founded her own business in Denver in 1906. Her third husband, Charles Joseph Walker, became her business partner and she adopted his name for her company. By early 1910, Madam Walker had settled in Indianapolis, then the nation's largest inland manufacturing center, where she built a factory, a hair and manicure salon, and her second beauty school. Less than a year after her arrival.

Walker grabbed national headlines in the black press when she contributed \$1,000 to the building fund of the "colored" YMCA in Indianapolis. Walker moved to New York in 1916, leaving the day-to-day operations of the Madam C. J. Walker Manufacturing Company in Indianapolis to two trusted employees, but continuing to oversee new business development.

IN HARLEM

Once in Harlem, she quickly became involved in the city's social and political life, taking special interest in the NAACP's anti-lynching movement to which she contributed \$5,000. As her business continued to grow, Walker organized her agents into local and state clubs, founding the Walker Hair Culturists Union of America in 1917. That same year, she hosted the organization's first convention.

MAY 1919

By the time Madam Walker died in May 1919 at her estate, Villa Lewaro in Irvington-on-Hudson, New York, she had helped create the role of the 20th Century, self-made American business woman; established herself as a pioneer of the modern black hair-care and cosmetics industry; and set standards in the African-American community for corporate and community giving.

THE LEGACY

Today, Walker's legacy lives on through the Madam C.J. Walker Theatre Center, a National Historic Landmark in Indianapolis, and through events like today's Madam C.J. Walker Economic Empowerment Expo and Luncheon presented by the Phoenix Metropolitan Chapter of the National Coalition of 100 Black Women, Inc. Honorable Vice Mayor Denette Dunn City of Peoria, Pine District

Vice Mayor Denette Dunn currently serves as the Vice Mayor for the City of Peoria where she has served as council member since April of 2019. In addition to her role as council member she currently serves as Chair to the city's Boards and Commissions Subcommittee. She has an extensive background in the private sector as well, where she served as Marketing and Government Relations Director at Dixon sweeping. She also managed the entire southwest area for Republic Services for over 5 years, which involved managing \$85 million in municipal contracts. In her role with Republic Services she was a registered lobbyist and worked to pass legislation and establish law for equitable partnerships between private entities and municipalities. She served as the President of the Arizona Recycling Coalition and also served as Board Member on WESTMARC - the Western Maricopa Coalition which addresses important issues facing the west valley.

Former Flagstaff, AZ, Mayor
Topic: Bridging the Gap of Pay Equity
Through Entrepreneurship

Former Flagstaff, AZ, Mayor Dr. Coral Evans is a social entrepreneur passionate about public policy that creates opportunities for civic engagement, civil discourse, community revitalization, and advancement.

Her family (the Dorsey's) has been in Arizona for six generations and has been an active part of the Flagstaff and greater Northern Arizona community since the early 1900s.

As a small business owner, author, and social-profit executive, she has over 25 years of experience in community redevelopment, investment, and business.

Dr. Evans has a Ph.D. in Sustainability Education (area of focus; Statesmanship), a master's degree in Business Administration, and a master's level certificate in Public Management. She is a Hunt-Kean Leadership Fellow, a Babson College Social Innovation Fellow, a Flinn-Brown Foundation Center for Civic Leadership Fellow, and the co-producer of the award-nominated "Lived Black Experience CommUnity Dialogues" Podcast Series.

Dr. Evans was named one of the 48 Most Intriguing Women of Arizona for 2022 by 48 Arizona Women and the Arizona Historical Society. As Mayor, she was recognized by the Arizona Business Magazine as one of Arizona's "Most Influential Women in Business." 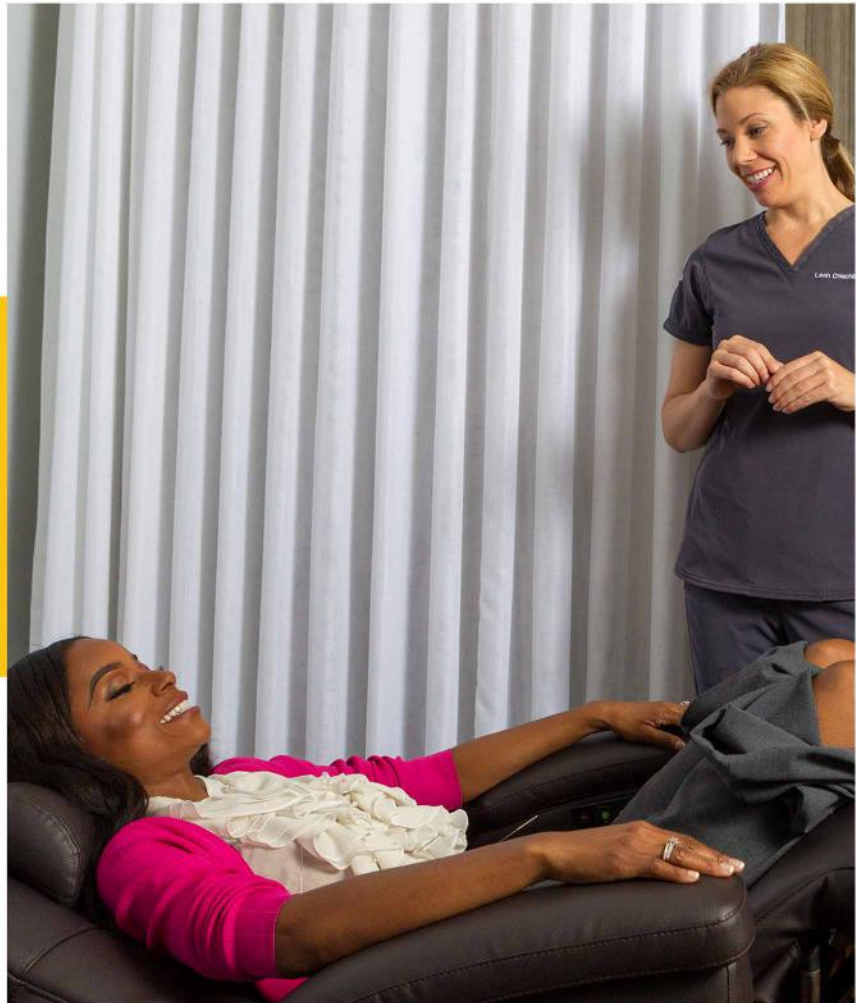

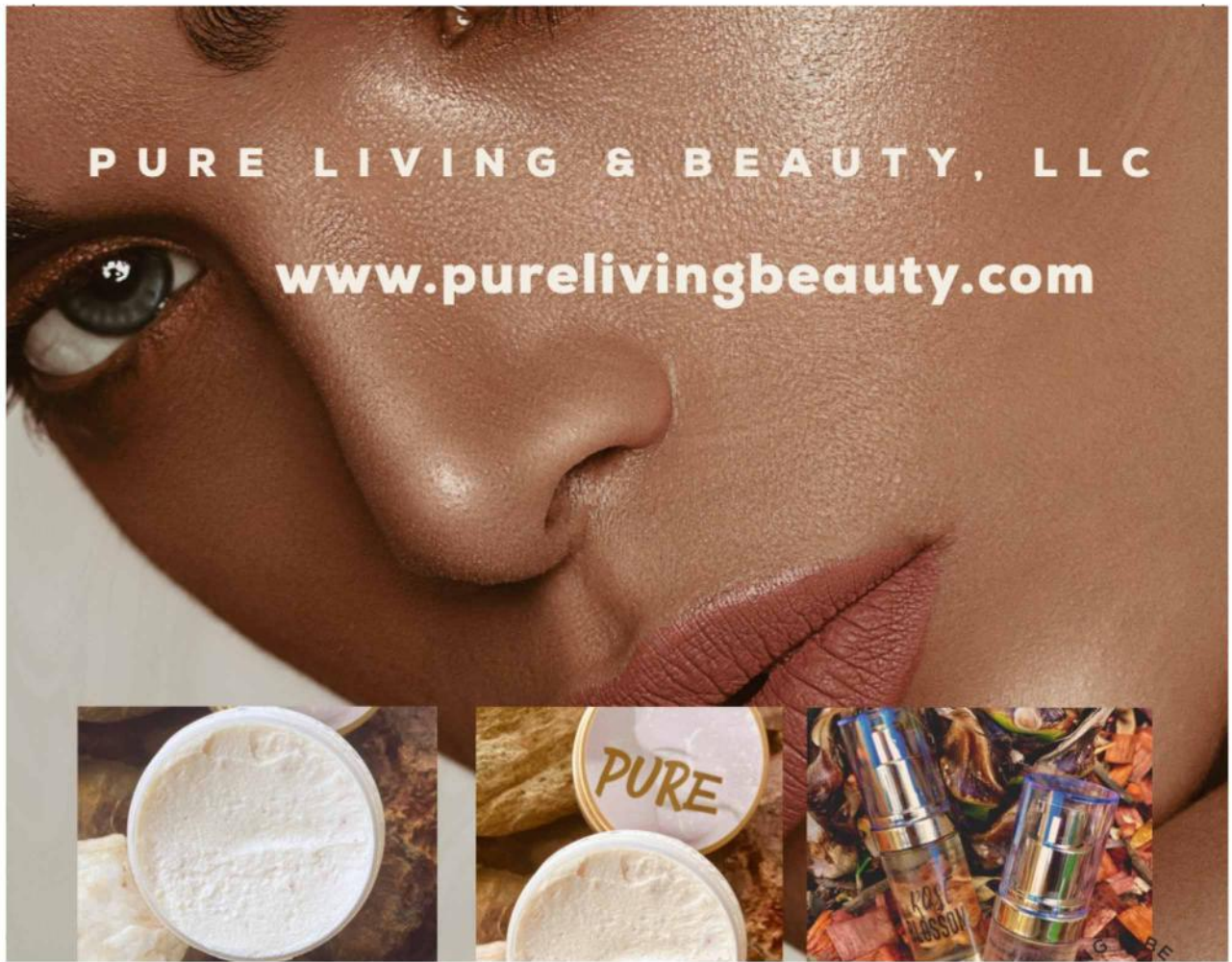

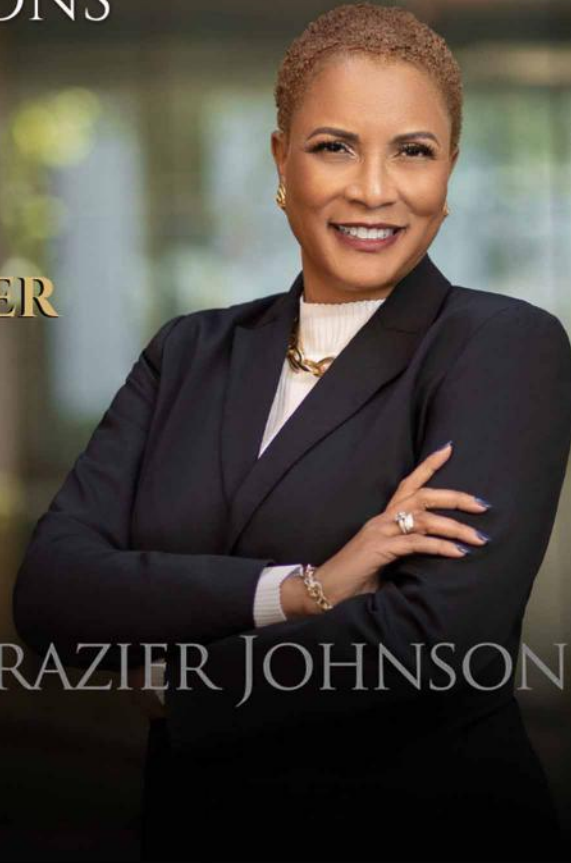
